- 9:30 am** **Meet Etgar Staff at Court Square Fountain & Rosa Parks Statue**
Explore this historic center of town where Rosa Parks boarded the bus for her famous ride, visible from the Capital building and Dexter Ave Baptist Church.

- 10:15 am** **Equal Justice Initiative Legacy Museum**
Learn about the evolution of oppression from slavery to mass incarceration and the creation of a narrative of racial difference.
